Accommodation:

The 08 air conditioned Cottage rooms and 10 Luxury Tents at Jungle View are comfortable and spacious, complete with attached bathroom with running hot/cold water as well as a balcony sitout.

How to reach

By Air: The nearest airport reach Ranthambore National Park is Sanganer Airport in Jaipur. The distance between Jaipur and Ranthambore is about 150 km and there are regular flights for Jaipur from all the major cities including, Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Bangalore, etc.

By Rail: The nearest railway station that connects Ranthambore National Park to other important cities is Sawai Madhopur Railway Station, which is located at a distance of 10 km from the Resort.

By Road: Delhi to Ranthambore- 382 Km Jaipur to Ranthambore 180 Km Udaipur to Ranthambore- 388 Km Agra to Ranthambore- 239 Km Bharatpur to Ranthambore- 202 Km





About Park

The 392 sq km of Ranthambore National Park is perhaps India's finest example of Project Tiger, a conservation effort started by the government in an attempt to save the dwindling number of tigers in India. Situated near the small town of Sawai Madhopur, the Park has seen its ups and downs, and there were times not so long ago when poachers were having a field day in the Park. But recently thanks to the devoted work of some good field staff the forest has been restored to its old glory and is now seen as a much needed stronghold for the tiger which is battling for survival.

What is so special about this Park is the way history and forest have come together to create an amazing landscape not seen in very many places. The rich forest around the fort is littered with ruins that date back to the 10th century. Parts of the fort that lie inside the Park have been reclaimed by nature. Can you imagine the sight of a wild tiger seeking shelter under architectural brilliance on a hot summer day, or a leopard standing majestically on the walls of the old fort?

Safaris

The most exciting aspect of a visit to a wildlife sanctuary is the safari into the jungles, of meeting the unexpected and completely missing the expected. Animals can be seen in a zoo also, but the dangerous thrill of actually encountering a wild beast in its natural habitat is a sure method of testing ones patience and bravado. Park is open from October to June & best times to view wildlife are the early mornings & evenings. Open can hire open roofed canters and open jeeps too.

Activities

Ranthambore Tiger Reserve is famed for its Jungle Safaris on Jeep and canter. We offer Ranthambore Jungle Safaris in 4 x 4 Open Suzuki Jeeps and 20 seater canters with front facing elevated seats.

Village visits, bird walks and picnics at water bodies are regularly organised. A day trip Chambal River can also be organised, Chambal offers great opportunity to see Gharials, Crocodiles, different species of turtles, Jackals, Hyenas, Foxes and different species of birds.
